

Updates from previous weeks:

- Please ensure you are completing the **Daily Health Check** with your children each day prior to sending them to school. Parents can use the K-12 Daily Health Check update https://bit.ly/3GacVs3 This is also posted on the top of Tiger News in the right hand box for quick reference.
- K-12 Ministry of Education & Health updates:
 - Masks Are no longer required in school settings, but staff and students can choose to wear masks.

- All visitors need to check in at the office upon arrival. If visitors/volunteers are staying for an extended period of time they need to sign in on a paper visitor form at the office. If you have an item to be delivered to your child's classroom please bring it to the office for delivery.
- End of day dismissal will continue to be outside on the playground, so there are no interruptions to instructional time.
- The BC Ministry of Health has sent all schools rapid test kits for each student. These test kits will hold 5 tests and are meant to assist families with the <u>daily health check</u>. Rapid tests can be picked up at the school or upon request can be sent home with your child. Please either call the school or email to have the tests sent home.
- Fees Thanks to all our families that have paid their school fees. We still have outstanding school fees that need to get settled. You can pay these in MyEd parent portal with a credit card, send cash or cheque and we will now accept e transfer. The office will be contacting families via a phone call if fees are unpaid. Please let us know if an error has been made and your school fees have been paid. You can send this e transfer to taypayments@prn.bc.ca. It will not ask for a password. If it does, do not send and contact the school instead. Thanks!

Winter Reading Olympics

During the month of February, all Taylor students, staff, and families are challenged to **GO FOR THE GOLD** by reading as much as they can. This also includes any Home Reading assigned by the classroom teacher as well as time adults (not siblings) read TO their children. The more time students spend reading (and listening), the better readers they will become... plus, the more they will be eligible for prizes, and of course, a chance to earn medals for their country (their class). There will be prizes for students who meet the bronze, silver, and gold goals, for students who read the most overall minutes, for classes with the highest medal count, and even a few random draws for those who remember to hand their slips in on time.

Attached are four Reading Log bookmarks, one for each week of the challenge. You may chose to cut off the first week and use it as a bookmark, or leave it attached and cut it off when the week is complete. Either way, be sure to record the minutes read (and read to) every day, tally the total minutes read for the week, and sign the bottom before returning it to school each Monday.

Students will receive medals for their class based on the weekly goals for their grade.
